Tailoring is a craft which is the basic necessity of everyone in rural as well as urban areas. Most of the trafficked girls hail from rural areas where there are no industries. But the most necessary requirement is various designs of clothes. In today's world, fashion designing is fast developing sector. Thus tailoring is the most preferred profession in rural areas.

Many of our girls are trained for tailoring. Three of our girls are employed in a fashion designing institute. They have attained the goal of their lives.

A conference on Regional Consultation on Uniform Case Management System' was organized by Plan India at Delhi in November. Our President Mrs. Triveni Acharya participated in the conference. The lacuna and challenges in case management system and in the collaboration with Community Based Organizations was discussed in detail to improve the methodology of investigating the history and status of the girl victim.

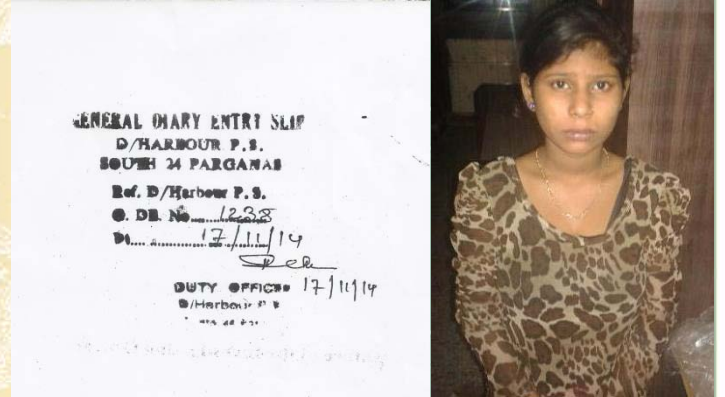

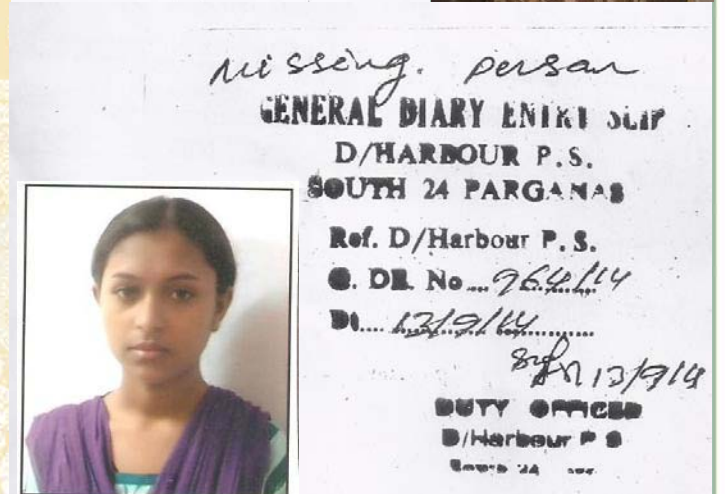
The Rescue raid Operation Freedom:

It was a grand success for Rescue Foundation where our three offices' teams conducted 5 different rescue operations & Rescued 29 Girls in November 2014.

- Operation Freedom in Kamathipura Red-Light Rea, Mumbai, Maharashtra-07th November 2014-14 Girls (14 Major) Rescued-00 Accused Arrested
- Operation Freedom in Kashmiri Bazaar Red-Light Area, Agra, Uttar Pradesh-08th November 2014-05 Girl (02 Minor and 03 Major) Rescued-02 Accused Arrested
- Operation Freedom in Kamathipura Red-Light Rea, Mumbai, Maharashtra-14th November 2014-06 (01 Minor and 05 Major) Rescued-02 Accused Arrested
- Operation Freedom in Sil Daighar, Thane, Maharashtra-27th November 2014-02 Girls (02 Minor) Rescued-02 Accused Arrested
- Operation Freedom in Budhwarpeth Red-Light Area, Pune - 28th November 2014-02 Girl (01 Minor and 01 Major) Rescued



2 Missing complaints from 24 south Parganas, West Bengal. Two sisters were operating the illicit business of prostitution in Budhwarpeth of Pune in two different brothels situated side by side in the same building. One girl who was minor (below the age of 18 years) was forced to prostitute in one of the brothels. The minor girl took advantage of business rivalry between two brothel managers (sisters), she informed her home in 24 South Parganas, West Bengal that she was forced to work at the particular address in Pune on 17th November 2014. Her family informed the address to local NGO, Child line who contacted us to rescue the girls. We located the minor girl and started the in-brothel counseling with her. Ultimately both girls were rescued by us on 28th November 2014.
